In total, 116 former clients arrived at Broadway Lodge. Many staff members agreed that this year's reunion seemed to feel particularly enjoyable and special. It was wonderful to see so many former clients looking so well and loving their time back at the Miracle Mansion™. There were some happy tears too, from ex-clients feeling a surge of emotion as they arrived.

The new finish at 6pm instead of the usual 5pm, allowed Markkus and the team to cram in more than ever and nothing felt too rushed, the afternoon flowed smoothly.

Some of the new additions this year was the sale of Broadway Lodge hoodies and t-shirts and raffling sessions with limited spaces which were for a sound bath, reiki, mahalo meditation and Indian head massage. Another new feature at this years' reunion included a live electric guitar piece from Queen's 'We Will Rock You' being played in Chrissy's drumming circle (which our local MP, Dan Aldridge, took part in). Thirty in-person aftercare clients and Broadway Lodge aftercare staff made the trip to Castle School (a secondary school) on Thursday 9th October at the invitation of Head of Faculty, Martin Wilkins (pictured above, first left). Broadway Lodge clients in recovery have been warmly welcomed by staff and pupils over the years. On this occasion we were joined by very willing ex Sefton Park clients too.

Our time at the school featured a presentation by Helen Thorn, Aftercare Counsellor, followed by breakout sessions where clients were able to share their experiences with pupils and answer any questions. Helen thanked all clients who attended, particularly for their time, words and energy given so freely to the pupils during the day. She went on to say "what a gift you have delivered to those pupils today, thank you from the bottom of my heart."

Here's What some of the clients said after the visit...

"Wow, what an amazing experience. I didn't know if I would be able to go through with this. It was an emotional experience but well worth it and I hope the kids will get something out of it."

"The whole experience was a privilege and a pleasure."

"A very emotional but spiritual experience for me. It brought back the reality that I have a 13 year old daughter out there who needs her mum. I really enjoyed the opportunity to give something back."

"I was apprehensive but feel really proud that I was able to share my story and hopefully influence some young people not to make the same mistakes I did."

"Thanks to everyone who took part in making it a good day from start to finish. I found it unexpectedly very emotional from the second those kids started entering the school hall. I started having strange flashbacks to when I was as innocent as them. I felt sad for the boy I was back then, and I felt even sadder knowing that it's likely some of those kids will end up having to go through the same thing as we have. So, if what we've done today changes just one path, one life, then it's been an amazing day."

Room named after former client "The Kennedy Room"

Back in September 2024, we held an auction at our special 'red carpet' reunion in our 50th anniversary year. One of the auction lots was to have one of the bedrooms named after themselves or someone they choose. We had a winning bidder and they chose to name the room after their friend, John Kennedy, who came into treatment at Broadway Lodge in 2005.

Once John completed treatment, he later returned as a volunteer and then in a paid post as a support worker for a period of time, lifting spirits in the house with his witty, bubbly, friendly and caring personality.

John has written a brief summary of his journey into Broadway Lodge which is forever encapsulated on a plaque and fixed in the corridor outside of bedroom 25 (now known as 'The Kennedy Room'), located on the ground floor opposite the lift.

On the 22nd October, John returned to Broadway Lodge to see the plaque in place and it was wonderful to see him again, smiling and happy in his 20th year of recovery.

A big thank you to the bidder and to John, for making this happen.



The plaque reads:

"I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone at Broadway Lodge - both those who came before me and those who will come after.

My life began with a background marked by violence and crime, where love was scarce and, when it was shown, often came at a cost. For many years, I found myself in various institutions from children's homes to category A prisons and even spending five consecutive years in the high-security mental institution of Rampton,

However, on the 5th of December 2005, I entered treatment at Broadway Lodge and completed my journey on the 16th of July 2006. Today, I am approaching my 20th year of complete abstinence and I'm frequently asked what led me to be where I am today. The answer is simple: it was the unconditional love and compassion shown to me by the staff and peers at Broadway Lodge.

Their support was the catalyst for my transformation, and it is through that love and understanding that I was able to start anew."

There is a women-only session on Wednesday mornings focused on one of the '5 ways to wellbeing', and a mixed-gender group session in the afternoon which usually involves auricular acupuncture followed by a sound bath or drumming circle.

Growing Awareness

This year, numerous employees have attended different conferences and events to represent Broadway Lodge in order to help spread awareness of our services as well as the importance of the addiction treatment sector. We have also been involved in government lobbying, aiming for addiction treatment to be kept top of mind in government as we all know how vital it is for people struggling with addiction in the UK to be able to access the support they need.

Conferences and events Broadway Lodge have exhibited at have included:

Health & Wellbeing at Work: a 2-day event in Birmingham targeting employers.

UKESAD: a 2-day sector conference meeting with other providers to learn and share ideas and best practice.

Drink & Drug News (DDN) conference: a 1-day event in Birmingham attended by various drug and alcohol support charities and services.

North Somerset Recovery Festival: a 1-day celebration of recovery right here in our local town of Weston-super-Mare.

Parliament & Lobbying: Our CEO, John, has represented Broadway Lodge and Choices Rehabs (a network of independent UK rehabs that we are a member of), at numerous government meetings. He spoke to MP's in parliament with Karen Biggs (CEO of Phoenix Futures), in October, to once again highlight how vital addiction treatment services are so that those who need it can get well. In addition, he joined with representatives from some of the Choices network to have a meeting with Dame Carol Black and on another occasion, with David Gourke, both influential and well respected figures to MP's and the government in Westminster.

Support from our local MP

We have been delighted with the interest and enthusiasm that our local MP, Dan Aldridge, has for Broadway Lodge and other addiction services in and around Weston-super-Mare.

Dan has shown genuine passion about the sector. He understands the incredible impact that happens when an individual is able to have the right support to get into recovery and how it not only changes their lives, but the lives of everyone around them.

In the summer, Dan visited Broadway Lodge and spent time with the team, learning about what we do. He also attended our reunion and said some beautiful words about Broadway Lodge and the people he met that day in a video that he posted on social media after he left. One week later, he engaged with the recovery community once again at the North Somerset Recovery Festival, and is keen to continue supporting the sector.
